



## INTER-CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS ENTRY RULES

### Club Eligibility

Clubs must be affiliated to a PaddleUK National Association (Canw Cymru, Paddle England, Paddle Northern Ireland or Paddle Scotland) and registered with the Slalom Committee.

### Competition Rules

The competition will use the British Canoe Slalom Competition Rules.

### Club Member's Eligibility

Each squad member must be a full member of the club for which they are competing on the 1st July. They do not need a slalom ranking.

### Squad Entry Acceptance

An entry will be accepted only upon receipt of the following:

- A fully completed application form
- Confirmation that every member is a member of the specified club

### Squad Composition

A full squad will consist of 12 boats (13 paddlers). Each member will compete in an individual race and a team race. Each squad must have a manager to deal with correspondence before the event. The manager (or a delegate) must be available to attend meetings whilst the competition is in progress.

There will be four teams of three competitors, comprised of:

Team A	1 X Premier K1 Man 1 X Premier K1 Woman 1 X Division 1 K1 Man
Team B	1 X Veteran or Master K1M 1 X Division 2 K1 Man 1 X Division 3 K1 Man
Team C	1 X Division 1 K1 Woman 1 X Division 2 K1 Woman 1 X Division 3 K1 Woman
Team D	1 X C1 Man 1 X C1 Woman 1 X C2

Note also:

- Any paddler who has previously been ranked but does not have a current ranking, cannot enter a race more than one division below their highest ranking division. A team member's ranking status (if any) is taken on the 1st July.
- Paddlers ranked as a Veteran may only enter the Veteran, Premier, Division 1 or Canadian races – they are not eligible to enter the Division 2 or Division 3 races without applying for re-ranking using this form - <https://www.canoeslalom.co.uk/emails/reranking.htm>
- Competitors from a lower division may paddle in a higher division race.
- Competitors ranked in Premier or Division 1 in any event may take part in only one individual race and the corresponding team race.
- Competitors ranked in Division 2 or below, may paddle in up to 2 different individual races.
- A female competitor may paddle in the men's race of the same division.
- Note you do not have to have a full squad to compete, there are trophies for incomplete squads.

### **Entry**

- Any club who would like to enter needs to email the organiser, Donna Hawkins, [donna@canoeslalom.co.uk](mailto:donna@canoeslalom.co.uk) to request an application form as soon as possible. The completed form must be returned to the organiser to arrive no later than 1st June.
- Where a club is unable to field a complete squad from their own membership, that club may partner with a second club.
- When your entry has been accepted, your Squad Manager will be able to enter the event through [Canoe Slalom Online Entries](#). Entries will be open from 1st July to 1st August. The squad should, where possible, be entered all at the same time but it will be possible to add further paddlers at a later date (up to 1st August), if necessary.
- There are no late entries on the day but paddlers may be substituted at the Squad Manager's meeting held the Friday night before the competition starts.

### **Entry fees**

The entry fee is £25 per boat. (£300 for a complete squad of 12 boats). The entry fee includes race fees, parking, camping and an Interclubs t-shirt. Payment is due only for the actual number of individuals entered. There is no extra charge for the squad manager or supporters.

### **Officials Duties**

All clubs will be required to carry out officials duties: judging, start and finish etc. There is no official's event.

### **Scoring, Trophies and medals**

The winning squad will be the one with the least points. The race winner gets one point, 2nd gets 2 points etc. Points are earned at 12 individual races and 4 team races. There are perpetual trophies and medals to be won.
